APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Scholarship Application Forms are available upon request from the Executive Assistant, Mrs Pasqualina Pascale.
- 2. The application must be complete with all documents listed in the checklist being submitted with the application, even if you have provided them before. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 3. More than one criteria can be applied for.
- 4. Applicants will be short listed and notified of the status of their application and any interview details.
- 5. The due date for applications is 4pm Wednesday 19 July 2023.
- 6. Interviews for short listed external and internal applicants are planned for the week starting 26th July 2023.
- 7. The interview panel will consist of two members of the College Executive team. For specific scholarships, a specialist in that area may also be present. Family members of any applicant will not be eligible to sit in on the interview or selection panel.
- 8. Offers will be made to successful applicants by the end of term 3.
- 9. Successful applicants will be asked to accept in writing the terms and conditions of being awarded a Trinity Lutheran College scholarship.
- 10. New students will complete a Contract of Enrolment and Terms of Enrolment which will need to be returned at the same time as the letter of acceptance.

There are four levels of scholarships:

- Level 1 is 50% tuition for 12 months
- Level 2 is 25% tuition for 12 months
- Level 3 is 25% tuition for up to 4 years (maximum 4 years for entering year 7 students)
- Level 4 50% of a student standard Instrumental tuition for one instrument for 1 year.

A scholarship may be discontinued should academic effort and student conduct be considered unsatisfactory. If the scholarship is declined or withdrawn for any reason the Scholarship will not be recognised.

SCHOLARSHIPS - Trinity Lutheran College offers a range of scholarships for students from Years 1 to 10. Applicants must exhibit the attitudes and attributes of an all-round learner, demonstrate exemplary behaviour and work habits and be prepared to uphold the Christian values of the College.

Group A Scholarships: Open to students <u>NOT</u> currently enrolled at the College entering Year 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10 in 2024.

Academic Scholarships

- Level 3.
- The applicant must currently demonstrate a high level of achievement in their studies.

Spirit of Learning Scholarships

- Level 3.
- The applicant must demonstrate a love of learning and a preparedness to develop themselves as a lifelong learner as per the IB Learner Profile. (Attached).

Sports Scholarship

- Level 1.
- The applicant must demonstrate all round sporting ability, commendable sportsmanship and potential for sports leadership.

Music Scholarship

- Level 2 plus Level 4 Music tuition in the selected instrument for a period of 1 year (not including theory).
- The applicant must be currently studying a musical instrument for at least 12 months and be eligible to be part of the instrumental ensemble program.

Group B Scholarships: Open to baptised members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Mildura

- Level 1.
- **Priority to students entering year 7**. Other year levels will only be considered should there be no eligible year 7 applicants.

Group C: Open to current students of Trinity Lutheran College continuing at the College in 2024.

Academic Scholarship

- Level 1.
- For students progressing into years 6, 7, 8 and 9.
- The applicant must currently demonstrate a high level of achievement in their studies.

Sports Secondary Scholarship

- Level 2.
- One awarded to a primary student and one awarded to a secondary student (as per year level in 2024).
- The applicant must demonstrate all round sporting ability, commendable sportsmanship and potential for sports leadership.

Spirit of Learning Scholarship

- Level 2.
- One awarded to a primary student and one awarded to a secondary student (as per year level in 2024).
- The applicant must demonstrate a love of learning and a preparedness to develop themselves as a learner as per the IB Learner Profile. (Attached).

Music Scholarship

- Level 4 (not including theory lessons)
- The applicant must be currently studying a musical instrument for at least 12 months and be eligible to be part of the instrumental ensemble program.
- One awarded to a **primary student** and one awarded to a **secondary student** (as per year level in 2024).
